

## CLOVERBUD PRESENTATION

Gather information on your subject, make posters on your subject, gather items about your subject to show, and **PRACTICE, PRACTICE, PRACTICE** your talk.

Maybe try for around 5 minutes-start to finish.

Last poster can show resources (where you got your information)—example: books, internet web sites, people, magazines, etc.

**(Juniors and seniors will do more posters and times of 7-12 minutes).**

- Set up posters on easel and any items to show on table in front of you (while the judges are busy with papers from person before—Moms can help with this step).
- When you are ready, ask “Are the judges ready?”
- “Attention getter” --Say or do something cute, funny, or interesting to grab judges’ attention.
- “Hello, my name is \_\_\_\_\_”, “I’m a member of \_\_\_\_\_ 4-H Club”, “I live in Rutherford County”, “I am \_\_\_\_ years old.” (information on 1<sup>st</sup> poster).
- “Today, I’m going to talk to you about (say title and show Title poster)”.
- Talk about subject by using what is on posters or any items you brought to show (on table in front of you).
- Tell about your resources (where you got your information)—books, internet web sites, magazines, etc. (show on last poster, also, if you want).
- When you are finished, smile, and ask “Do the judges have any questions?”
- Answer questions politely (if you don’t know the answer, it is okay to say “I’m sorry, I don’t know”, but SMILE when you say it.)

**Remember when you talk, talk loud enough that people in the back of the room can hear you and when you hold something up to show, hold it high enough that they can see it.**
